

**STATE OF MARYLAND VS. CARLOS DANIEL GONZALEZ-RABINES**

**IN THE CIRCUIT COURT FOR BALTIMORE COUNTY**

The Jurors of the State of Maryland, for the body of Baltimore County, do on their oath present that CARLOS DANIEL GONZALEZ-RABINES, on or about February 16, 2019 in Baltimore County, did, unlawfully, in a grossly negligent manner, kill Kennedy Sookal, against the peace, government, and dignity of the State.

(Negligent Manslaughter-Auto/Boat/Other Vehicle, CR.2.209, 1 0909, )

***This Charge Is Classified As A Felony And Is A Jailable Offense With A Maximum Penalty Of Incarceration Up To 10 Years And Fines Of Up To \$5000.00.***

**SECOND COUNT**

And the jurors of the State of Maryland, for the body of Baltimore County, do on their oath present that CARLOS DANIEL GONZALEZ-RABINES, on or about February 16, 2019, in Baltimore County, did cause the death of Kennedy Sookal, as the result of driving a vehicle in a criminally negligent manner, against the peace, government, and dignity of the State.

(Criminally Negligent Manslaughter Vehicle/Vessel, CR.2.210.b, 1 1611,)

***This Charge Is Classified As A Misdemeanor And Is A Jailable Offense With A Maximum Penalty Of Incarceration Up To 3 Years And Fines Of Up To \$5000.00.***

**THIRD COUNT**

And the jurors of the State of Maryland, for the body of Baltimore County, do on their oath present that CARLOS DANIEL GONZALEZ-RABINES, on or about February 16, 2019, in Baltimore County, did drive a motor vehicle in a manner that indicated a wanton and willful disregard for the safety of persons and property, against the peace, government, and dignity of the State.

(Reckless Driving, TA.21.901.1.a, 15664,)

#### **FOURTH COUNT**

And the jurors of the State of Maryland, for the body of Baltimore County, do on their oath present that CARLOS DANIEL GONZALEZ-RABINES, on or about February 16, 2019, in Baltimore County, did drive a motor vehicle in a careless and imprudent manner so as to endanger the property and the life and person of any individual, against the peace, government, and dignity of the State.  
(Negligent Driving, TA.21.901.1.b, 15665,)

#### **FIFTH COUNT**

And the jurors of the State of Maryland, for the body of Baltimore County, do on their oath present that CARLOS DANIEL GONZALEZ-RABINES, on or about February 16, 2019, in Baltimore County, unlawfully did fail to control the speed of a motor vehicle on a public highway as necessary to avoid colliding with any person or any vehicle or other conveyance that, in compliance with legal requirements and the duty of all persons to use due care, is on or entering the highway; against the peace, government, and dignity of the State.  
(Failure To Control Veh. Speed On Hwy. To Avoid Collision, TA.21.801.b, 15648,)

THE GRAND JURY further avers and alleges that the offenses charged hereinabove were against the peace, government, and dignity of the State.


TO THE PERSON CHARGED:

1. This paper charges you with committing a crime.
2. If you have been arrested and remain in custody, you have the right to have a judicial officer decide whether you should be released from jail until your trial.
3. If you have been served with a citation or summons directing you to appear before a judicial officer for a preliminary inquiry at a date and time designated or within five days of service if no time is designated, a judicial officer will advise you of your rights, the charges against you, and penalties. The preliminary inquiry will be cancelled if a lawyer has entered an appearance to represent you.
4. You have the right to have a lawyer.
5. A lawyer can be helpful to you by:
  - (A) explaining the charges in this paper;
  - (B) telling you the possible penalties;
  - (C) Explaining any potential collateral consequences of a conviction, including immigration consequences;
  - (D) helping you at trial;
  - (E) helping you protect your constitutional rights; and
  - (F) helping you to get a fair penalty if convicted.
6. Even if you plan to plead guilty, a lawyer can be helpful.
7. If you are eligible, the Public Defender or a court-appointed attorney will represent you at any initial appearance before a judicial officer and at any proceeding under Rule 4-216.2 to review an order of a District Court commissioner regarding pretrial release. If you want a lawyer for any further proceeding, including trial, but do not have the money to hire one, the Public Defender may provide a lawyer for you. To apply for Public Defender representation, contact a District Court Commissioner.
8. If you want a lawyer but you cannot get one and the Public Defender will not provide one for you, contact the Court Clerk as soon as possible.
9. **DO NOT WAIT UNTIL THE DATE OF YOUR TRIAL TO GET A LAWYER.** If you do not have a lawyer before the trial date, you may have to go to trial without one.
